As I promised to write to you again as soon as I arrived at this place, I am afraid you will think that my promise has not been kept very well. I arrived here on Friday night. but did not find any letters, as they has just sent the last to my address at Wilmington. I have been so very unfortunate in my correspondence lately, and there is so little to tell you, that I feel but little interest in writing. There are a great many stories going, as usual in the Regt but there is nothing, that is reliable, known in regard to being mustered out. It is likely that we shall be ordered home, before a greatwhile, but I cannot tell you any thing definite about it.

Do not expect us too soon, and so get disappointed I am very anxious for the time to come, when I can see you again.

Perhaps you would like to know something about Raleigh, and the other paces, here, but I do not feel like writing about it, so I will wait till we meet, and tell you.
